Agency Reports:

CLCC: CLCC had a conversation regarding evacuation requests and the process for how we issue and execute emergency evacuation notices. This involved a situation occurring earlier in the week in the Upper McKenzie area. CLCC can issue out notification via the cell service in comparison to the ability of Lane County. Additional reports included developing a new phone system package for CLCC. There are a few remaining contracts needing to be completed for the next fiscal year of dispatch contracts.

OSFM: Discussion about bringing in the IR and aircraft support for the Green Hill fire and supporting the efforts in Mohawk Valley.

LCSO: SAR provided an update on status and their efforts with regional fires and evacuation notices going on.

Region 5/LCC: See the website for training available around Lane County. Mobile fire training unit is currently scheduled to come to Lane County most likely in October. LFA Fire Officer 1 hybrid course with online training in August and in person training in October. ICS 300 class posted on the Region 5 website. Challenge coins from Region 5 are being distributed.

Lane ESD CTE Program: An update was provided through email from Shareen Vogel. There are bi-monthly meetings that are happening and the discussion subjects. If you're not in the loop and want to participate in the development process or the meetings, we can connect you with Shareen via her email.

Radio Group: PM's are underway at many of the sites including repairs that are underway. Engagement with Adcom for consultation for communication plans and studies in our area. Reminder, we're working on a notification list to keep people informed regarding radio outages etc. An update was provided on our regional grant funding that Lane County has received including the directed funding.

Wildland: Update was provided on the status of our deployments around the region and the fires currently in Lane County.
